Antecedents - Frances Lloyd - Painter (1855 - 1921)

Time lapse postcards


In 1889, after the untimely death of her husband Capt. Walter Lloyd, RN, Frances Lloyd moved from Rome, where they had lived for almost 10 years, to the Cornish fishing town of St Ives. The St Ives artists' colony had recently formed, after Julius Olsson and Louis Grier had opened the town's first art school in 1888. The St Ives School of painting established itself, and Frances was among the early pioneers. (Her son William, George Lloyd's father, later purchased St Eia, and became the Secretary and the President of the St Ives Arts Club.)

Frances Lloyd first rented rooms at Albany Terrace, then later spent much of her time at Bridge Cottage, in the nearby village of Zennor, where she painted a series of landscapes and domestic scenes using *tempera* painting, which she had learned from Louis Recklebus.

The George Lloyd Society has reproduced a selection of these tempera paintings as a series of postcards. The following pages show the paintings in their original form, and also superimposed on contemporary photographs of the same landscape, taken 130 years later.









